



Music Masterclasses

'Whistle and Sing' - Learn Songs, Airs and tunes in this beginners class for all ages.

Ages 5+

Time: 10am - 1pm Cost for 5 days: £50

No experience necessary. You will need your own Tin Whistle (make sure it's in the key of D).

After a short introduction to the basics of the Tin Whistle, the aim of the class is to learn a new tune every day. The technique we will use is by ear and tablature (diagrams), so prior musical knowledge is not needed although notes will be given as an optional reference.

Singing for beginners will be taught by Armagh Pipers Club tutor Pearse McMahon. Participants will learn to sing songs from the traditional Irish repertoire, in the aural tradition in which they were originally passed from one singer to another. We will explore the historical, literary and geographical background of songs originating from different parts of Ulster with a particular focus on the street songs of Belfast. The class will also include an introduction to basic singing techniques, as well as an overview of styles of traditional singing, such as ornamentation and phrasing.

Flute with Harry Bradley

Harry was born in South Belfast. The vibrant recording heritage from the 1920s and 30s has had a huge influence on his flute-playing style as has the playing of musicians such as Seamus Tansey, Desi Wilkinson and piper Seamus Ennis, to name but a few. Noted for his unique tone and driving rhythm, Harry has come to be recognized as one of the most Harry Bradley distinctive traditional flute players in Ireland today.



Music Masterclasses

Fiddle with Gerry O'Connor

Gerry O'Connor is regarded as one of Ireland's master fiddlers. Playing with Michael Coleman's contemporary John Joe Gardiner in the 1970's formed Gerry's style of music, focusing on the fluid and ornamented lyrical fiddle playing of the great Sligo masters. He grew up in the town of Dundalk in a family of musicians, dancers and singers. A four

times winner of The Fiddler of Oriel competition he has played and recorded with such highly-regarded groups as Lá Lúgh and Skylark (Len Graham, Gary O'Briain & Mairtin O'Connor).

Fiddle with Brid Harper

Bríd Harper is undoubtedly the doyenne of Irish fiddlers. From Castlefinn in Co Donegal, Bríd started learning the fiddle at 9 years of age. She won all the underage competitions at All Ireland level and in 1988 was recipient of Senior All Ireland, The Fiddler of Dooney and Oireachtas na Gaeilge titles.

Fiddle with Liz Doherty

Donegal fiddler and musicologist Liz Doherty, is highly regarded as a traditional Irish fiddle player and renowned teacher. She imparts what is best about Irish music - sheer fun and joy! She brings to her playing an exuberant energy that is rhythmical and powerful. Liz has recently been appointed as Director of the new Acadamh Ceoil at Cultúrlann Uí Chanainn in Derry. She also runs a traditional music school - Scoil Trad Bhun Cranncha - with Jim Woods.

Fiddle with Martin Dowling

Martin Dowling was born in Chicago of Irish parents in 1960. He began to play the fiddle professionally in the early 1980s while studying economics and history. His early influences included Liz Carroll and Kevin Burke, and he absorbed and studied the styles of all the great Sligo fiddlers, past and present. He married flute player and singer Christine Dowling in 1987 and they moved to Belfast in 1994 to further pursue music and Irish history.

From Co. Fermanagh, **Brian McGrath** is an excellent banjo player who was a member of the original line-up of Four Men and a Dog and played those great duets with Cathal Hayden on the band's debut album "Barking Mad." He also recorded with John Carty a banjo duet album, "The Cat that Ate the Candle," which is considered a must-have for those interested in Irish banjo playing.

Traditional Singing with Ríoghnach Connolly

Ríoghnach Connolly is an Armagh born singer and flautist strongly rooted in the Sean-nós singing tradition of Oriel, she also stirs elements of Appalachia, Blues and Jazz into the folk archive cooking pot. Based in Manchester she has many musical projects amongst them HoneyFeet, The Breath, Afro Celt Sound system & her own 'Black Lung' project.

Edel is one of the most accomplished Irish musicians of her generation. In 2004, Edel was awarded one of the highest honours for a traditional musician in Ireland – the TG4 Young Musician of the Year award. She is a regular performer on Irish National Radio and the BBC and has performed at festivals and in concert halls from North America all the way to Asia with musicians including Jackie Daly, Cherish the Ladies and The Kane Sisters.

Highland Piping with Ross Ainslie

Ross Ainslie is one of Scotland's finest traditional musicians and composers, playing pipes, whistles and cittern. He is renowned for his highly acclaimed solo material, and as a skilled performer and prolific collaborator who performs regularly with bands Treacherous Orchestra – of which he is a founding member – Salsa Celtica, Dougie Maclean, Charlie Mckerron, India Alba, and with Jarlath Henderson.

Dermot Byrne is one of Ireland's foremost traditional musicians having been awarded TG4's Traditional Musician of the Year 2013. From Buncrana in the Inishowen peninsula, the most northerly part of Donegal, he played accordion from a young age with his father the inspirational Tomás O'Beirn, (Tommy Byrne) an enthusiastic promoter of the tradition. Dermot has had the good fortune to meet all the

A long-time anchor of Altan, Byrne's subtlety as an accordion player has always marked him apart

Tin Whistle with Mary Bergin

Mary Bergin – 'Just about the best Tin Whistle player this century' is how the Irish Times referred to Mary in a recent interview. She was born into a very musical family and began playing at an early age winning many awards in Oireachtas and Fleadh Ceoil competitions, including the All-Ireland Championships at Junior and Senior level.

Mary's first solo album 'Feadóga Stáin' brought out in 1979, holds its place as a classic in latter- day traditional music. Her second solo one in 1992 was referred to as having Biblical status with fans of Celtic music.

She has toured extensively in Europe, America and in Australia playing in concerts and festivals, and giving workshops and seminars. She has also given masterclasses in many Universities around the world.

Willie Drennan is a well-known multiinstrumentalist, singer, writer and storyteller from County Antrim. He led the Ulster Scots Folk Orchestra from 2000 until 2009 and continues to perform regularly, locally and abroad. Willie will demonstrate the fifing and drumming traditions of Ulster and discuss the crossover of traditional


