Niamh Parsons has come to be known as one of the most distinctive voices in Irish music. Her voice has drawn comparisons with such venerated singers as Dolores Keane, June Tabor and Sandy Denny. Described in the Boston Herald as both 'emotionally haunting' and 'tonally as clear as crystal', Niamh's albums have been 'must-have' collectors' items for any lover of songs and singing. She has recorded seven solo studio albums and two live albums to date, and has been a guest on numerous other albums. Niamh duets with her partner, fellow Dubliner, Graham Dunne—there is a spiritual bond between the two when they perform, which draws out the essence of the songs. We are delighted to welcome one time Belfast resident Niamh back to the city for this very special performance.

Sinead McKenna is a fiddler from County Tyrone and a recent recipient of the TG4/Belfast City Council Bursary Award. To recognise five successful years of Belfast hosting TG4's prestigious Gradam Ceoil awards, Belfast City Council along with TG4 have created a bursary scheme (2022 -2027) for young emerging traditional musicians in the city. Each year, three new recipients will receive support from the scheme. The objectives of the scheme are to enhance traditional music in Belfast, support creativity and cultural expression, professional development and to help promote Belfast as a UNESCO city of music. In partnership with Red Shoe Media. The Duncairn Arts Centre will provide support, media training and mentorship as well as producing a broadcast-quality music video for each recipient. The word 'genius' may be over-used these days, but there's no other way of describing the phenomenon of Sean Maguire in the world of traditional music. The Belfast man rewrote the book on fiddle playing after bursting onto the scene in the 40s with a combination of dazzling virtuosity, high creativity and passion for performance. 

With Fife & Drum Concert

Tonight we explore the traditions of Scotland and Ireland through Bagpiping, Drumming, Uilleann Piping, Fifing, Flute, Tin Whistle & Bodhrán, featuring some of the world's finest musicians.

Alastair Donaghy comes from Omagh, Co.Tyrone. He is currently a member of Field Marshal Montgomery Pipe Band, with whom he has won several major championships, including two world titles, the most recent in August 2018. Alastair has also had success on the solo scene having won titles at Junior and Intermediate Level, as well as success across the water, most notably a C Grade light music double at the Scottish Piping Society of London Competition, in 2015. Alastair was also crowned Young Piper of the Year in 2014. He now competes at Senior Level and was the winner of the Open Hornpipe and Jig at the Ulster solos in April 2018.

Mary Bergin – 'Just about the best Tin Whistle player this century' is how the Irish Times referred to Mary in a recent interview. She was born into a musical family and began playing at an early age winning many awards and competitions. Mary's first solo album 'Feadóga Stáin' brought out in 1979, holds its place as a classic in latter- day traditional music. Her second solo album was referred to as having Biblical status with fans of Celtic music. She has toured extensively in Europe, America and in Australia playing in concerts and festivals, and giving workshops and seminars. She has also given masterclasses in many Universities around the world.

From Belfast **Gareth McLees** began drumming at 8 years age playing for Glasdrummond and North Belfast Pipe Bands. He was taught by Stephen Rourke of Field Marshal Montgomery Pipe band, and the drumming legend, the late Bobby Rea, himself a 3-time World Solo Champion and Champion of Champions.


Harry Bradley was born in South Belfast. The vibrant recording heritage from the 1920s and 30s has had a huge influence on his flute-playing style as has the playing of musicians such as Seamus Tansey, Desi Wilkinson and piper Seamus Ennis. In 2014 he was the recipient of the TG4 Gradam Ceoil Traditional Musician of the Year Award.

Ian Burrows and **Andy McGregor** are Belfast TradFest board members and are highly regarded Highland Pipers and Smallpipers who have performed and taught music the world over.

Tara Bingham comes from Comber in Co. Down and learned her early music from her father Leslie Bingham, also a flute player. Her brother Terry, now living in Clare, plays concertina and accordion. Tara was influenced by musicians such as Paddy Tyrell from Dundalk (flute and sax), Cathal McConnell (flute) and Tom McHale (whistle) who visited the Bingham house and would record tunes on tape for her to learn. She is one of a group of accomplished flute players who emerged from the greater Belfast area in the late 1970's, and is renowned for the tone and smoothness of her playing.

Mikie Smyth began playing the pipes over 21 years ago in the Pipers Club in Henrietta Street, Dublin. He had the opportunity and privilege to learn from and play with many of the great pipers who were always so generous with their time and expertise. Mikie has performed both as a soloist and with shows (Riverdance and Ragus) in over 25 countries across 5 continents. He has recorded a solo album 'The Wild Keys' and has also recorded with Donal Lunny, Maurice Lennon, Sean Keane and 'The Rubberbandits' to mention a few.

Tommy Hayes has been at the forefront of traditional Irish music for over 40 years. He has performed and recorded with most of the great names itraditional music and beyond. He has been a member of a number of ground- breaking groups, including Stockton's Wing, Puck Fair, Altan, Liam O' Flynn and the Pipers Call Band and the Eileen Ivers Band.

Belfast Harp Festival Féile Cruitirí Bhéal Feirste

The Belfast Harp Festival, called by contemporary writers "The Belfast Harpers Assembly",11-14 July 1792, was a four-day event organised by merchant class Presbyterians Dr. James McDonnell, Robert Bradshaw and Henry Joy, (proprietor of the Belfast News-Letter and uncle to Henry Joy McCracken). It's purpose was to revive an interest in harp music and to collect the music of the harpers and note their style of playing for future generations. What was hoped to be a revival, proved to be a farewell to the old tradition. Eleven harpers attended. Seven were blind. The eldest, Denis Hempson (1695 - 1807) from Derry, was 97. He was the only one to use the ancient way of playing with the fingernails. By far the most important thing that happened at the festival was that a young man from Armagh named Edward Bunting(1773-1843), was employed to write down the music of the harpers, and to make notes on their instrumental techniques. He dedicated the rest of his life to collecting and preserving Irish music. He published three volumes of music, collectively known as the Ancient Music of Ireland.

Tonight we pay tribute to that event and the Bunting Collection.

Dàibhidh Stiùbhard Miadhachlughain O'Donnell

Dàibhidh Stiùbhard is a singer, hailing originally from "a place with no name" (where there's not even a road sign!) – Tullywiggan in Co. Tyrone. He's regarded as a traditional singer, but even this ready tag turns out to be something of a conundrum, if not a contradiction in terms, since, as he candidly admits on the liner notes of his debut album: "I was not born into or brought up with the tradition. I came from a Church Of Ireland background, yet traditional music did creep into my childhood. As I grew older, I slowly reclaimed the right to own my native culture and language... and yet at times, I feel like An Sionnach Dubh (The Black Fox). A strange little creature outside the norm, finding my way through the vast rich realm of songs native to these islands."

Miadhachlughain O'Donnell is a brilliant young flute player and traditional singer from Castlewellan Co. Down. Growing up steeped in and surrounded by traditional music, it is no coincidence that she is blossoming into a consummate and charismatic performer. Her mother Tiona McSherry was the lead singer in the highly acclaimed 90's band Tamalin and her uncle John McSherry is regarded as one of the finest Uilleann pipers of all time, and has variously been a member of Dónal Lunny's Coolfin, Lúnasa, At First Light, Ulaid and The Olllam.

We're excited to see what these two brilliant emerging artists have in store for us tonight.

Flutopia Concert

Belfast is synonymous with the sound of the flute. Energy and creativity are very much the hallmarks of the Belfast style. The music of this city invariably has a persistent and hypnotic pulse which draws the listener into a trance like state, reminiscent of that cast by the chanting of Buddhist monks. Tonight's concert features some of the world's best traditional flute players and whistlers.

Harry Bradley's distinctive rhythmic playing style is influenced by early recordings of Irish music, and by the great flute players of counties Galway, Sligo and Leitrim. In 2014 he received the Gradam Ceoil TG4 Musician of the Year award for his contribution to traditional music.

Mary Bergin – 'Just about the best Tin Whistle player this century' is how the Irish Times referred to Mary in a recent interview. She was born into a very musical family and began playing at an early age winning many awards in Oireachtas and Fleadh Ceoil competitions, including the All-Ireland Championships at Junior and Senior level.

Tara Bingham comes from Co. Down and learned her early music from her father Leslie Bingham, also a flute player. Tara was influenced by musicians such as Paddy Tyrell from Dundalk, Cathal McConnell and Tom McHale who visited the Bingham house and would record tunes on tape for her to learn.

Barry Kerr is a multi-instrumentalist, composer, singer and painter. Steeped in the traditions of this island, Barry Kerr's creative work – both as a painter and as a musician – expresses the very heart of Irish life. Originating from the southern shores of Lough Neagh in Co. Armagh, Kerr is now living and working in Connemara, Co. Galway.

Maria Rafferty has long been a stalwart of the Belfast flute community. Having studied with the McPeake School of Music, and having had the opportunity to spend many years in the company of well-known and respected musicians from the locality, Maria has a wonderful repertoire and style which she passes on to the many students she teaches in the greater Belfast area and beyond.

Brendan Kerr was introduced to traditional Irish music through Irish dancing from a very young age, competing up to world championship level until he was 18. Through dance, he discovered traditional music and wanted to learn the tunes to which he had spent years dancing to.

Well-known as one of the greatest bodhran players of all time,

Tommy Hayes has been at the forefront of traditional Irish music for over 40 years. One was Band

Taken from a line in the poem Mná na hÉireann written by South East Ulster poet Peadar Ó Doirnín (1704–1796), and is perhaps more widely known as a song set to an air by Seán Ó Riada, tonight is a celebration of some the finest female traditional musicians, singers and dancers in Ireland.

One of Ireland's favourite singers **Muireann Nic Amhlaoibh** is from west Kerry. She has had a long track record of producing critically acclaimed albums, as well as enjoying a successful broadcasting career on both television and radio. She toured the world as a member of Danú, and her song repertoire is as wide as it is deep.

TG4 Gradam Ceoil winner **Angelina Carberry** is an exceptional banjo player, known for her solid rhythm and delicate articulation. She is from a very well-known Longford musical family and she is steeped in the tradition. Quite simply, she is one of the best tenor banjo players of all time.

Caitlín Nic Gabhann is a concertina player, performer, teacher, composer and percussive dancer. Having toured for years as a dancer with Riverdance, three time All-Ireland concertina champion Caitlín is a regular performer at festivals and concert halls from North America to Asia over the last 15 years.

Síle Denvir is a harpist and sean-nós singer who is deeply influenced by her upbringing in the Connemara Gaeltacht where she was surrounded by music and song from an early age. She is a founding member of the group Líadan and has toured with The Chieftains.

Edwina Guckian has now taught her steps and shared the stage with some of Ireland's most influential acts such as Altan, De Danann, Dervish, Mairtín O Connor, Frankie Gavin, Kíla, Martin Hayes, Séamus Begley, and Laoise Kelly to name a few. She set up Airc Damhsa Culture Club for youths in her area to have a space to be immersed in traditions and cultures from home and all across the world in a fun and non—competitive environment. In April 2022, she was awarded the TG4 Gradam Comaoine for her outstanding contribution to culture.

Doireann Ní Ghlacáin hails from the north-side of Dublin, and is steeped in the rich musical tradition of the area. From her paternal family, The Glackins, she learnt the fiddle under the tutelage of her father, Kevin Glackin. She has recently completed a PhD in NUIG. Much of her thesis relates to the music studied by her grandfather Seán Ó Riada.

Liam Ó Maonlaí is one of the most talented, charismatic and soulful performers of Irish traditional music today. But his musical prowess goes beyond his own cultural roots as he blends an eclectic mix of folk, blues, gospel, soul, rock, and more with his amazing vocals and an array of instrumental mastery from piano to flute, harmonica to bodhran. Since first bursting onto the scene in the 1980's with his band Hothouse Flowers, Liam has captured the attention of audiences, critics and musicians alike. According to "Rolling Stone Magazine" Bono noted the ensemble were the "best unsigned band on the planet." It is no wonder that Liam remains a "musician's musician" and no surprise he has performed alongside the best of them. Learn songs, airs and tunes in this beginner's class for all ages. No experience necessary. You will need your own Tin Whistle (make sure it's in the key of D). After a short introduction to the basics of the Tin Whistle, the aim of the class is to learn a new tune every day. The technique we will use is by ear and tablature (diagrams), so prior musical knowledge is not needed although notes will be given as an optional reference.
