Through partnership and collaboration we aknowledge and celebrate the cultural diversity of the different traditions here and we are extremely proud of our work in bringing people together, in a shared and defining cultural celebration of traditional music, song and dance from these islands. Established and emerging musicians come here to create and perform, and audiences are attracted to enjoy our cultural treasures at first hand. I hope you'll enjoy our full programme of concerts, masterclasses, workshops, talks, céilís and the ever growing McConnell's Irish Whisky Session Trail which has over 60 sessions this year.

Sharing our traditional arts is a vital part of our human existence, connecting us and enriching lives, and we cherish that. We are so excited to bring this full programme of events to the people of Belfast and to invite many new visitors to our city from all over the world.

Music in the Glen | Róis

Music in the Glen is an exciting new trio. Featuring the combined talents of Brendan Mulholland (flute) and founding Réalta members Conor Lamb (uilleann pipes,

whistles) and **Deirdre Galway** (guitar), these musicians deliver the infectious rhythm and soul which are the hallmarks of the very best of traditional Irish music.

The trio hail from the counties of Antrim and Down, and this is strongly, but not exclusively, reflected both in their styles of playing and their



selection of tunes. No matter the provenance of their music, the unifying strand is their tightness of playing and the understanding between each other, forged over 20 years of playing together in Belfast and beyond. Individually they have featured on multiple recordings and have performed with a variety of international acts including Réalta, Gráinne Holland, Craobh Rua and Mary Dillon.



Róis (Rose Connolly) is a composer, performer and multi-instrumentalist, from County Fermanagh. Her body of work includes ensemble, large-scale and small-scale works, solo pieces, electronic solo & ensemble pieces and short film works. Her unique sound is an idiosyncratic combination of modernist and contemporary music with inflections of Irish traditional music, folk and jazz. Rose maintains a busy performance schedule in Ireland, performing with an array of professional musicians in both jazz, traditional and classical contexts.

Alasdair Donaghy from Tyrone has had a very successful solo piping career, both here in Northern Ireland and in Great Britain. As a member of FMM, he has won the World Championships 3 times, as well as a host of other major and All-Ireland championship prizes.

Kris Coyle from Ballyclare has certainly made a mark in solo piping including 4 x Northern Ireland Piper of the Year, 2 x Ulster Solo Champion, 5 x Ulster Solo Champion Hornpipe and Jig, Inveraray Games (B grade Piobaireachd) 2018 and 4 x Loch Lomond Highland Games Overall Champion.

Reece Doherty from Ballykelly is an up-and-coming solo piper who has had success in local solo competitions and is the current U18 All Ireland champion. He is a current member of Grade 2 Manorcunningham Pipe Band.

Alan Glenholmes from Cullybackey currently competes with Grade 1 Closkelt Pipe Band and has previously played with St Laurence O'Toole and Cullybackey Pipe Band. He has won several prizes in solo competitions across Ireland.

Individually recognised as figureheads of the tradition, **Mairtin O'Connor**, **Cathal Hayden** & **Seamie O'Dowd** have built solid reputations as masters with astounding skill, diversity and virtuosity. Together they produce a vibrant and musically charged experience.

Maeve O'Donnell, Ciara Maguire & Catríona Ní Ghribín are the current recipients of the TG4 Belfast City Council Bursary Award. To recognise five successful years of Belfast hosting TG4's prestigious Gradam Ceoil awards, Belfast City Council along with TG4 have created a bursary scheme (2022 -2027) for young emerging traditional musicians in the city. Each year, three new recipients will receive support from the scheme. The objectives of the scheme are to enhance traditional music in Belfast, support creativity and cultural expression, professional development and to help promote Belfast as a UNESCO city of music.

Fiddle Concert in Memory of Seán Maguire

The word 'genius' may be over-used these days, but there's no other way of describing the phenomenon of Sean Maguire in the world of traditional music. The Belfast man rewrote the book on fiddle playing after bursting onto the scene in the 40s, with a combination of dazzling virtuosity, high creativity and passion for performance. It was a style which pushed the boundaries, nettled the fundamentalists and which he himself called 'progressive traditional'. We pay tribute to the man and his music with a concert featuring some of the finest traditional fiddlers on the planet. Also on the bill; a man considered to be the patriarch of Ulster traditional singing Len Graham and probably the world's greatest tenor banjo player Gerry 'Banjo' O'Connor. This will be a cracker!

Bríd Harper from Castlefinn in County Donegal, is regarded as one of the leading Irish traditional fiddle players of the last forty years.

Len Graham is an award-winning traditional singer from County Antrim who holds great passion for the songs of his native Ulster.

Gerry 'Banjo' O'Connor is described by many as the best four string banjoist in the history of Irish music.

Méabh Smyth from Armagh is the current TG4 Gradam Ceoil Ceoltóir óg na Bliana.

Scottish fiddler **John McCusker** has shared stages with Paul Weller, Paolo Nutini, Teenage Fanclub, Graham Coxon and Eddi Reader. Since 2008, he has been a member of Mark Knopfler's band, playing arenas around the world including a double bill with Bob Dylan at The Hollywood Bowl.

Belfast fiddler and academic **Conor Caldwell** is known for his energetic northern fiddle style. His music is informed by his research, which explores both archival and contemporary sources.

Siobhán Peoples is steeped in the musical history of counties Donegal, through her father Tommy, and Clare, through her grandmother Kitty Linnane, the pianist with the original Kilfenora Céilí Band.

Ademar O'Connor from Edenderry, Co. Offaly was recently crowned Fiddler of London 2023.

Ryan Molloy is widely recognised as one of the masters of modern accompaniment in Irish traditional music.

MC for the evening will be Johnny Murphy, former pupil of Seán Maguire.

Flutopia Concert

Belfast is synonymous with the sound of the flute. Energy and creativity are very much the hallmarks of the Belfast style. The music of this city invariably has a persistent and hypnotic pulse, which draws the listener into a trance-like state, reminiscent of that cast by the chanting of Buddhist monks. Tonight's concert features some of the world's best traditional flute players and whistlers from Belfast and beyond and it promises to be a spectacle of brilliant solo and collaborative performances.

A co-founder of Flook and Lúnasa, and a linchpin of Capercaillie's line-up since 1998, Manchester-born flute/whistle and uilleann pipes maestro **Michael McGoldrick** has in recent years performed around the globe in ex-Dire Straits legend Mark Knopfler's band – including a tour with both Knopfler and Bob Dylan.

Belfast born **Desi Wilkinson** is a traditional musician of international repute, known principally as a flute and whistle player and a singer. He has previously recorded two critically acclaimed solo albums, along with five albums with the renowned group Cran.

County Down flute player **Martha Guiney** has been immersed in the traditional music scene from her childhood and has toured internationally and collaborated with many renowned artists worldwide. She has recently released her debut album, The Raven's Call to great critical acclaim.

Mary Bergin – 'Just about the best tin whistle player this century' is how the Irish Times referred to Mary in a recent interview. She was born into a very musical family and began playing at an early age winning many awards in Oireachtas and Fleadh Cheoil competitions, including the All-Ireland Championships at Junior and Senior level.

Maria Rafferty has long been a stalwart of the Belfast flute community. Having studied with the McPeake School of Music, and having had the opportunity to spend many years in the company of well-known and respected musicians from the locality, Maria has a wonderful repertoire and style which she passes on to the many students she teaches in the greater Belfast area and beyond.

Gary Duffy is a highly respected flute practitioner and contributor within the traditional music scene of Belfast and beyond. He holds a Masters and Fellowship alongside other vocational traditional music teaching qualifications.

Jude Scott is a member of the Glengormley School of Traditional Music and has attended all four previous editions of Belfast TradFest as a student, learning from masters such as Harry Bradley & Kevin Crawford.

Muireann Nic Amhlaoibh's childhood in West Kerry saw her immersed in a rich cultural environment and vital living tradition, which was to be hugely influential on the foundation of her distinctive vocal and instrumental sound. She spent thirteen years as lead singer and flute player with the Irish traditional supergroup Danú, and has since gone on to pursue a hugely successful solo career as a singer and broadcaster.

Best Emerging Artist RTÉ Folk Awards 2022, **Cathal Ó Curráin** is a multiinstrumentalist and hails from an exceptionally musical family in the West Donegal Gaeltacht. He plays fiddle, banjo, bouzouki and is also a wonderful singer.

John Doyle - Founding member of the highly acclaimed super group Solas that led him to performing worldwide. His signature guitar sound, singing and songwriting are deemed essential to many of the stellar artists in Irish traditional music.

Described as a born collaborator by The Irish Times, **David Power's** commitment to finding innovative ways to present the uilleann pipes has resulted in various styles of collaborations and projects.

Longtime resident of Belfast, **Lorraine Ní Bhriain** hails from a famous family of musicians in County Clare and is a highly regarded performer and tutor on the concertina.

Féile Cruitirí Bhéal Feirste Belfast Harp Festival

In association with Cultúrlann McAdam Ó Fiaich.

The Belfast Harp Festival of 1792, was a four-day event organised by merchant class Presbyterians Dr. James McDonnell, Robert Bradshaw and Henry Joy, (proprietor of the Belfast News-Letter and uncle to Henry Joy McCracken). It's purpose was to revive an interest in harp music and to collect the music of the harpers and note their style of playing for future generations. What was hoped to be a revival, proved to be a farewell to the old tradition. By far the most important thing that happened at the festival was that a young man from Armagh named Edward Bunting (1773-1843), was employed to write down the music of the harpers, and to make notes on their instrumental techniques. He dedicated the rest of his life to collecting and preserving Irish music. He published three volumes of music, collectively known as the Ancient Music of Ireland. We pay tribute to that event and the Bunting Collection and we celebrate Bunting's 250th birthday.

Laoise Kelly is described as the most significant harper of her generation and has pioneered a new style of driving instrumental harping which can be heard on over 70 albums including The Chieftains, Seamus Heaney, Christy Moore and Sharon Shannon.

Aisling Lyons is a multi-award-winning musician and composer from County Clare. She is the holder of 8 All-Ireland titles, has performed internationally and collaborated with distinguished artists and musicians in various projects.

Lauren O'Neill is the CEO of Harp Ireland and a sought-after traditional harper, teacher and researcher from Glenullin, County Derry who performs both nationally and internationally.

Daithí Gormley is regarded as one of the most accomplished Button Accordion players of his generation, he holds an extensive musical repertoire steeped in the rich musical heritage of his native county Sligo.

Úna Monaghan is a harper, composer, researcher and sound artist from Belfast. Her work combines experimental, traditional Irish and improvised music and live electronics.

Tiarnán Ó Duinnchinn is an award winning uilleann piper from Monaghan who started playing when he was around nine years of age in The Armagh Pipers Club. He has toured with Máire Ní Bhraonáin (Clannad), Laoise Kelly, Gerry O'Connor and Fintan Vallely amongst others.

Mick McAuley from Kilkenny is a long-time member of Irish-American ensemble SOLAS. He has been part of a movement which continues to push the musical boundaries of that tradition to bring Irish music to a wider and more diverse audience around the world.

Niamh Ní Charra is an award-winning multi-instrumentalist and composer who has recorded and performed with various artists including The Chieftains and Carlos Núñez and toured extensively as the featured fiddler with Riverdance.

Edwina Guckian hails from a family steeped in the tradition of music and dance and is greatly influenced by the style of local music she grew up with across Leitrim and Roscommon. She has shared the stage with some of Ireland's most influential acts such as Altan, De Danann, Dervish, Mairtín O Connor and Frankie Gavin to name a few.

Born into a County Longford musical family steeped in traditional music, **Angelina Carberry** followed in the footsteps of her father and grandfather by learning the banjo and has developed a highly personal style with unique rhythmical characteristics which has been captured on various albums.

Mirella Murray hails from county Galway and learnt under the guidance of Mary Finn. Having performed nationally and internationally with Cherish the Ladies, artists such as Sharon Shannon, Lunasa and the Bumblebees credit her as a source of uncommon melodies through her vast collection of tunes from her travels.

Composer and pianist **Ryan Molloy** is widely recognised as one of the masters of modern accompaniment in Irish traditional music. His compositions, rooted in the language of Irish traditional music, have been performed by world-leading ensembles.

Neil Martin (MC) is a composer and musician from Belfast with an international reputation, whose work has been performed across the world from Ground Zero to Mostar Bridge and the Royal Albert Hall, as well as being played on the International Space Station. A cellist and an uilleann piper, he has worked with many leading musicians.

He has previously recorded two critically acclaimed solo albums and has a host of other recording and performance collaborations that reflect his eclectic musical interests.

Gareth McLees from Belfast has enjoyed a very successful pipe band drumming career to date, including 4 World Championship titles and a Grade 1 world drumming title. In 2022 he was crowned UK Solo Snare Drumming Champion and is now the leading drummer of 13 x World Champions, Field Marshal Montgomery Pipe Band.

Martha Guiney from County Down has been immersed in the Irish traditional music scene from her childhood and has toured internationally and collaborated with many renowned artists worldwide. She has recently released her debut album, The Raven's Call to great critical acclaim.

Aimee Farrell Courtney – With a debut performance at the age of 8 at Dublin's National Concert Hall, Aimee's dynamic playing ranges from her renowned sensitive style of accompaniment to electrifying rhythmic solos and duets.

Andy McGregor (MC) & Ian Burrows are Belfast TradFest board members and are highly regarded Highland pipers and smallpipers who have performed and taught music the world over.

... a tale of how then 13 year old **Tyler Duncan** from Ann Arbor, Michigan went to Ireland and tracked down his hero, uillean piper and whistle player **John McSherry** (founder of Lunasa, Tamalin, At First Light, Ulaid, and a member of Donal Lunny's supergroup Coolfin: the most innovative Irish piper of his generation) and became his student, friend, and eventually his melodic partner in the ollam, a Transatlantic musical partnership enabled and maintained through early adoption of online collaboration and composition, resulting in the 2012 release of an eponymous album that has become a cult classic. The name derives from the old Irish word ollam, meaning a master of the highest rank in a particular skill.

Duncan had established himself as a multi-instrumentalist and Grammynominated producer (with Carly Rae Jepsen, Vulfpeck, Theo Katzman and others), and he recruited drummer **Michael Shimmin** (May Erlewine, Millish) and renowned Vulfpeck bassist **Joe Dart**, respected as one of the finest, funkiest players of these times, to form the olllam. With this core line up the band unleashed a new Transatlantic post-rock groove, lush with intricate trance-like melodies, stunning instrumental virtuosity and a magical marriage of tradition and technology, finding the listener somewhere between Radiohead and Planxty, or Tortoise and the ambient emotionalism of the Gloaming. Their second album "elllegy," was released in May 2022, ten years after their debut. It led to the olllam winning Best Folk Group at the 2022 RTE Radio One Folk Awards, and to the band committing to being available for wider European touring.

We're thrilled to host their biggest Irish show to date.


